



## THE HAGUE ACADEMY OF INTERNATIONAL LAW

### Note of the Secretary-General

(October 2017)

Since 1923, The Hague Academy of International Law contributes to the promotion of peace through law. Each year the Academy organizes a six-week session of Summer Courses at the Peace Palace, where it has its seat, in the vicinity of the International Court of Justice and the Permanent Court of Arbitration. The Summer Courses on **Public International Law and Private International Law** (see the poster of the 2018 Summer Courses) welcome more than 650 attendees from all over the world.<sup>1</sup>

The courses are given by renowned academics, diplomats and practitioners from various institutions in the world, in French or English, with simultaneous translation into the other language. The written version of the courses is subsequently published in the famous *Collected Courses of The Hague Academy of International Law*, published annually since 1923, and now comprising 386 volumes constituting a veritable encyclopedia of international law. Taking note of this unique activity, the United Nations General Assembly regularly underlines “the contributions of The Hague Academy to the teaching, study, dissemination and wider appreciation of international law” (A/RES/69/117, para. 17).

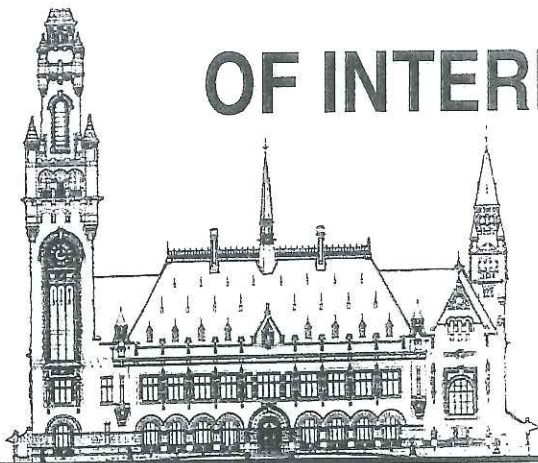
Over time, other activities have been added: the **Centre for Studies and Research, which is held immediately after the end of the session of the Summer Courses** (see the poster of the 2018 Summer Courses), but also the External Programme, which usually takes place in November, as well as various advanced programmes and Colloquia.

Altogether, these activities make the Academy an institution that is constantly evolving to adapt its dissemination of knowledge of international law to be in line with the needs of the time.

In this content, as of **January 2019, the Auditorium of the Academy will open its doors every winter to welcome students at its Winter Courses on International Law** (see the poster of the 2019 Winter Courses). Designed on the same model as the Summer Courses, the three weeks of this new Winter Courses’ programme is a new opportunity for many students from all over the world, who wish to attend

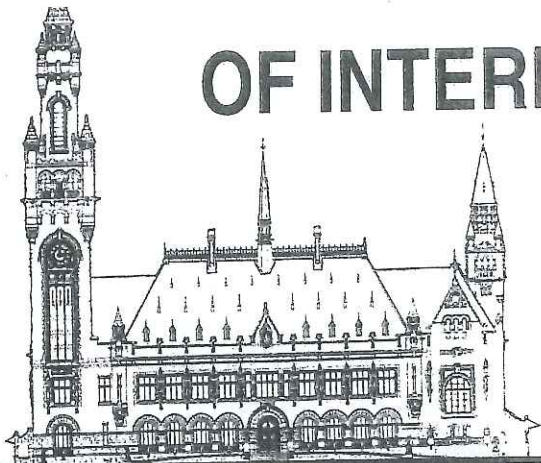
